Other suggested activities to support current class learning

These are some things that would benefit your child to be able to maintain and extend their learning;

Play

Learning through a wide range of play opportunities and talking about the play is important for Nursery aged children. At home you will have lots of play resources please use these and with your support to extend their ideas they will be learning more.

Please do take photos of their play to show us their learning. If you want, you could write a brief explanation of what they were doing at the time.

Maths	Shape hunt – looking for different shapes in the environment on signs, doors, and machines and using the shape names.
Literacy	<p>Reading stories together - some things to talk about;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Labelling the parts of the book – front cover, back cover, pages, spine, title, words, picture • What they can see in the pictures • Counting objects/animals/people in the picture • Thinking about what might happen next • Thinking about how a character is feeling • Can they retell the story using the pictures • Can they remember the characters in the story • Make their own version of the story or their own book <p>Practice writing their name in chalk, pen, pencil, crayons, paint etc. Please see https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/skyWriter/index.html for correct letter formation.</p>
Topic/Other	<p>Make play dough together and then use this to extend their fine motor skills making different shapes using their hands and fingers. Add other resources like kitchen utensils, buttons, role-play kitchen items such as plates and cups. Count the items that they have made. Talk about what is happening to the dough as they manipulate it. Use their imagination to find out what it could be.</p>

Play dough recipe –



Nature hunt outside to find and explore different mini-beasts, plants, animals. Talk about different features of the local environment for example shops or vehicles that you notice as you are out in the local area.

Sand play – filling, emptying, moulding, collecting shells, stones, looking at patterns and colours.
