Write a story about what happens and how you feel.</p>	<p><b>Role play</b> Act out a Roman myth with friends. Which role will you play?</p>	<p><b>Biography</b> Write a biography of Boudicca, writing a brief description of what she was really like</p>
<p><b>Maths stories</b> Write some maths stories in Roman Numerals.</p>	<p><b>Calendar</b> Create a calendar using Roman numerals.</p>	<p><b>Birthdays</b> Write your own and your family's birthday in Roman numerals.</p>	<p><b>Report writing</b> Write a report about how and why Roman numerals evolved in to the numbers we use today.</p>	<p><b>Make a clock</b> Design and make a clock using Roman numerals.</p>	<p><b>Roman Numerals</b> Write some facts about yourself in Roman numerals (your age, shoe size, height, and other facts)</p>
<p><b>Art work</b> Study the Roman display then create your own artwork based upon the display. <i>How many symbols of the Roman times can you include?</i></p>	<p><b>Jewellery and Pottery</b> Design and make your own piece of Roman jewellery or pottery. Images round the side of a pot could tell a story of one of the myths.</p>	<p><b>Mosaic</b> Design your own mosaic on square/graph paper</p>	<p><b>Draw or paint Boudicca:</b> Thinking about the images of Boudicca, draw or paint (watercolours) your own image of Boudicca. Can you explain which bits the Celts and Romans got right in their descriptions</p>	<p><b>Model Temple</b> Imagine that you are a Roman temple builder. Design and make a model of a temple to a god of your choice.</p>	<p><b>Roman artist</b> Study a Roman artist and create a piece of art based on their expertise.</p>
<p><b>Jewellery/Pottery</b> Find out about how roman jewellery and pottery was made and which countries it was imported from.</p>	<p><b>Shields/Helmets</b> Make/design roman shields and helmets</p>	<p><b>Armour/Weapons</b> Design your own Roman army armour and weapons</p>	<p><b>Mosaic</b> Make mosaic tile design using tiles</p>	<p><b>Make a clay pot</b> Make a replica piece of pottery using clay.</p>	<p><b>Roman bread</b> Make bread and write out recipe for others to use</p>

Draw them on a map of the modern world.</p>	<p><b>School</b> Did Romans go to school? How did they learn?</p>	<p><b>Hadrian's Wall</b> Create/make/build Hadrian's wall</p>	<p><b>Roman/Celtic Life</b> Find out similarities / differences between the Roman and Celtic way of life</p>	<p><b>The story of Boudicca:</b> Retell story of Boudicca through a storyboard – think about what happened, the order of events, and what might have been said.</p>	<p><b>Survivors diary:</b> Write a diary entry pretending you are one of the Iceni (a Celtic warrior who fought with Boudicca) or a Roman soldier and describe our feeling before, during and after the revolt.</p>
