Other suggested activities to support current class learning

1. Make a list of 20 objects that we would use now that the Victorians used.
2. Create your own William Morris inspired Art
3. Create your own invention to showcase at the Great Exhibition
4. Draw or paint a picture of a scene from the Victorian times e.g. Queen Victoria on the throne, a matchbox girl out on the street, a poor family eating dinner.
5. Write a short newspaper article announcing Queen Victoria's coronation.
6. Draw yourself as a Victorian – you can be any type of Victorian you like (royalty, poorhouse child, rich factory owner, maid).
7. Write a letter to Queen Victoria asking what it is like to be Queen.
8. Write an acrostic poem about the Victorians.
9. Make a 3D object from Victorian times.
10. Make and write a postcard sent from London in Victorian times.
11. Find out some foods the Victorians liked to eat and use these to design a menu for a Victorian café.
12. If you were Queen Victoria what new laws would you make and why?
13. Make a list of 10 adjectives to describe Queen Victoria.
14. Write a diary entry from a child who lives in the poorhouse. Talk about your day, what kind of things you do, and how you feel.
15. Cook a favourite Victorian recipe and take a photo or bring it into school!
