Aim: Pupils will attain age-related expectations for speech and language development Activity: Forest School Forest school focused on developing social skills and the characteristics of effective learning within both nursery and reception classes. Within this there have been planned challenges and focuses linked to the children's needs including writing, maths, science and elements of technology/understanding of the world and developing creative skills. The opportunities available to the children have been adapted to engage the children through their interests and links to stories	Increased self esteem, more resilience, forming good relationships with peers and adults in school
REAL REAL has been with the nursery children, due to the significantly low literacy starting point for approximately 2/3 of the cohort. Rich literacy experiences needed to be provided for the children and through REAL the staff have become more aware of how to engage parents and support them in how to provide opportunities both at home and in the local environment.	Pupils will have had the opportunity to be immersed in rich literacy experiences to support language development and low literacy starting points
WELLCOMM Wellcomm has highlighted to staff through assessments, the children that require further CL input. This is done through planned, structured sessions following the program of suggested activities. Staff have noted how the activity focuses can also be used within the child's play to further develop language and understanding of concepts.
