PARENT- TEACHER EVENINGS: We are looking forward to parent-teacher meetings in June. We will be sending details out towards half term and are awaiting any further updated guidance on how these can take place. Currently, we will be continuing with the virtual parents meeting via telephone or digital face to face link. This may change and we may be able to hold face to face meetings in school, we will keep you updated. The purpose of this terms meeting is to focus on progress since the school report was written, to discuss how your child has done with their identified next steps in learning.
