School Uniform

• You may be aware, through the media that the Government Policy on school uniforms is changing. As a school we are in the process of reviewing our uniform and would like your opinions before any decisions are made about what this might mean for our school. Curriculum

- In December Miss Bateman and Mrs Jones visited schools in Halifax to see and learn more about teaching maths through White Rose Maths. They visited two schools which are White Rose Maths hubs. The visit was really informative and we are reviewing our current maths teaching with a plan to develop and improve our current offer. The aim is to further raise standards in maths across our school. We have begun a partnership with St John's School in Jersey and will be working closely with them over the coming terms to develop and share best practice. As a first step, this week pupils from Y3 to Year 6 have begun daily times tables practice in an engaging format that they (the vast majority!) seem to be enjoying so far. Pupils in Years 1 and 2 have started Fluency Bee, which is a regular, fun and engaging way to learn and practice number bonds.
- On Monday, we have a Voice 21 programme lead visiting our school to observe our Oracy practices and recognise progress we have made since their last visit in 2023. As part of the visit the support staff will have a training session on Quality Talk in groups.
