Home Reading:

Please read as much as possible at home. Any child who reads 4 times a week will be entered into a raffle.

Other Homework:

Dojo Points: Pupils will earn dojos for homework, following the golden rules and showing learner traits. We will celebrate the achievements each Monday in assembly.

This term our learning will be based around the theme of 'Ancient Egypt'

Children will learn about the following...

Maths: We will practise the 4 operations, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division alongside shape, measure and statistics work. We will also learn about decimals and the use of the decimal point. We will have regular challenge activities to encourage reasoning and problem solving.

English: Much of the literacy work will be linked to the topics being taught in class. We will cover: reading, spellings, handwriting, composition, vocabulary, grammar and punctuation. We will be producing a fable, an adventure story and a biography of Howard Carter.

Focus texts: Marcie and the Riddle of the Sphinx, Cinerella on the Nile and the Story of Tuttenkahmun.

Science: Sound; The class will find how vibrations create sound and how to change pitch and volume.

Art/DT: Linked to Ancient Egypt. King Tut masks focussing on sculpture. In DT we will be building construction towers as apart of the Primary Engineer Construction Project.

PE: On Tuesday with our sports coach Sam and on Thursday at Langford swimming pool with Jersey Sports swimming coaches.

Computing: Photo editing and coding sessions.

Music: We will learn to sing and accompany songs with instruments.

PSHE: 'Being my Best' and 'Changing Me' plus regular Class Council meetings.

French: Conversational French- School subjects and sports.

History: Life in Ancient Egypt including Ancient Gods, farming, beliefs, mummification, pyramids and tombs.All linked to Oracy.

Geography: We will use maps and atlases to learn about ancient and modern Egypt and the value of the River Nile.

You can help your child to succeed by doing the following:

- Listen to your child read and sign their reading diary. When listening to your child read, please ask questions to ensure understanding of the text,
- Talk to your child about what they have done at school and encourage a positive attitude to learning,
- Be a role model as a life long learner!
