<u>Homework</u>

1. Seesaw: There will be one literacy and one maths task set once a week, on a Monday due by 8am Friday.

2. Reading: Pupils must read for 15 minutes, at least 4 times week and have their reading record signed by an adult, once a week (preferably on a Thursday ready for the Friday collection).

3. Times tables: Pupils should practise for 5 minutes, at least 3 times a week and record this in their reading record.

This term our learning will be based around the theme of

'The Stone Age'

Pupils will learn about the following...

Maths: Mathematical reasoning to investigate and solve problems as well as estimating and predicting. Pupils will also consolidate their learning in a range of activities.

English: Some English will be linked to the topic. Developing a detailed character description for the main character 'Tenko' from our class text. Pupils will be looking at the structure and features of information text and create a 'Survival Guide to Year 6,' as well as a time-slip narrative based on 'The Wild Way Home'.

Focus class text: 'The Boy with the Bronze Axe' By Kathleen Fidler.

Science: Animals including humans - recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way the body functions.

History: The Neolithic era – prehistoric Jersey and the evidence left behind.

RE: 'For Christians, what kind of king is Jesus?' and 'How does faith help people when life gets hard?'.

Computing: 3D modelling using online technology.

PE: Volleyball and Rounders.

Music: Charanga - Reflect, Rewind and Replay.

PSHE: 'Being my best' and 'Growing and changing'.

Art: Neolithic style sculptures and designing, making & evaluating Neolithic homes.

French: Revision of Salut Jersey Part Deux.

You can help your child to succeed by doing the following daily:

- Listen to your child read and sign diary once per week (preferably on a Thursday read for the reading raffle on Friday).
 - Practise quick recall of times tables and division facts
- Support and encourage your child to become independent and take ownership of their own learning.
