## News from around the school:

Nursery have enjoyed exciting learning this half term. From exploring rockpools at La Rocque beach and making limpet necklaces to hunting for treasure as pirates and mermaids, the children have embraced every adventure. They also enjoyed meeting Mr Marote and exploring a road sweeper, tractor and recycling truck as part of their vehicles topic.

Reception have had a fantastic June. In Drawing Club, the children brought stories to life through *Fugglers*, *Oliver's Vegetables* and *The Snail and the Whale*, developing their creativity, vocabulary and storytelling skills. Through play and exploration, they have continued to grow in confidence and independence.

Year 1 discovered a magical door that opened a portal to exciting new worlds, inspiring them to create their own adventure stories. In RE, they explored the festival of Sukkot and worked together to build dens using OPAL resources, learning about shelter, community and giving thanks.

Year 2 have enjoyed a busy term full of creativity and learning. In English, they produced fantastic writing inspired by their class texts, while in Maths they explored fractions, time, statistics, and position and direction. A visit to Samarès Manor brought their Science learning about plants to life, and they also developed their computing skills and created beautiful clay flower sculptures.

Working alongside a class from Hautlieu School, they have been preparing for the National Dance for Your Rights event, building confidence and teamwork. They also designed and created impressive volcano models and explored different types of rocks through hands-on science investigations.

Year 4 have continued their learning about the Ancient Egyptians, enjoying a memorable Egyptian Day where they made flatbreads, created sarcophagi and wrote hieroglyphics. In English, they wrote biographies about Howard Carter, while in Maths they completed their work on shape and began learning about statistics.

Year 5 enjoyed taking part in SwimSafe, learning essential water safety skills. They have also been busy preparing for their production of *Oliver with a Twist*. In class, they explored Mars through the Curiosity rover and developed their geography skills by studying Jersey's physical and human features using maps and Digimap.

Year 6 have been working hard to complete their Stone Age learning, prepare speeches for the Speak Up Speak Out competition and rehearse for *Oliver with a Twist*. They have also been reflecting on their fantastic residential experience at the Scout Centre, which included surfing, zip lining and aerial trekking.
